A note from your 2024 APA President

There are a few online blogs I follow regularly. Usually, they are concerned with employment law, something that intersects with my role as an ADA Coordinator for a public entity in many ways. I also follow the blog *Understanding the ADA*, written by a friend, APA member, and newsletter contributor, William Goren.



William recently alerted me to an issue that could significantly impact the work of accessibility professionals like us: the Supreme Court decision that overturned years of reliance on the expertise and opinions of federal agencies, known as "Chevron Defense."

Bill directed me to Richard Hunt, a Texas attorney who writes the blog *Accessibility Defense*. He recently had a **post** discussing the *Loper Bright v. Raimondo* decision and "the demise of *Chevron*." He mentions several interesting ways this decision might impact FHA lawsuits in the future. Mr. Hunt's blog doesn't allow for comments, but he indicated he would answer any questions our membership might email him if time permits.

I encourage our membership to read through the **post**. Doing so made me realize just how significantly the Supreme Court's decision *could* impact the way things are usually done in many different contexts, especially accessibility standards.
