The APA was recently asked to sign the Accessibility Coalition's letter to FEMA advocating for integrating accessibility measures, particularly the I-Codes and A117.1, into the agency's post-disaster public assistance projects guidelines. In response, the APA Board tasked the APA Technical Standards Committee with evaluating the letter and offering feedback. After review, APA officially signed the <a href="Letter">Letter</a>, underscoring APA's commitment to promoting accessibility.
